Paraskevi Ant. Dramalioti has studied Law. She is an excellent graduate of the National School of Public Administration and a doctorate holder of Management Science. She obtained two postgraduate degrees specializing in public and international law. She is a fellow of the "Maragopoulos Foundation for Human Rights", she has taught at Panteion University at undergraduate and postgraduate level, as well as at the National School of Public Administration with the scientific subject "issues of organization and operation of the state, coordination of government work and good legislation". She has authored a book entitled "The Executive State: Regulatory Cohesion and Coordination in the Center for Governance" (Papazisis & Center for European Constitutional Law, Themistoklis & Dimitris Tsatsou Foundation). At the same time, she has publications in journals and newspapers, participates in scientific conferences and studies. She has worked in key positions in the public sector, such as the Ministry of Interior and the Special Management Service of the Operational Program "Public Sector Reform". She has served as Head of the Department of Foreign Affairs and National Defense at the General Secretariat for the Coordination of Government Projects since its inception in 2013 and thereafter in the Presidency of the Government. She has taken part in technical negotiations with the troika, monitoring state-public administration issues. Particularly active member of the Alumni Association of the National School of Public Administration, offered her services as General Secretary, but also as the first "Alumni Advocate". Since November 2019, she has been appointed Vice President of the National Center for Public Administration and Local Government.
